Introduction from the Show's Chairman, Tom Hasted

Thank you for your interest in the 2026 Ellingham Show. First staged in 1947, the show is run entirely by volunteers and supporters of the Ellingham and Ringwood Agricultural Society (ERAS). This year's date is Saturday 8th August, and by the kind permission of Lord Normanton, we will once again be in the magnificent grounds of the Somerley Estate, near Ringwood.

Following a successful show in 2025, as a charity, it is always our ambition to continue to give away as much as possible to local charities and good causes. We have two main aims:

- To provide a great day out for participants and visitors by displaying a rich variety of rural activities, animals, crafts and competitions.
- And to give to local charities as much as we can afford from any surplus left after meeting our costs of putting on the show.

We take very seriously our responsibilities towards everyone involved in the show. We respectfully ask all our competitors to read and familiarise themselves with all our rules and conditions of entry, both the show in general, and to their chosen section(s) in which they wish to take part. All these rules and the various timetables – as at the time of this publication – are set out in the pages that follow.

It is never our ambition to change our plans however, sometimes it is necessary, and we hope that you will agree that the welfare of all our competitors and animals is of paramount importance.

As part of our duty of care for everybody on the showground, we also ask that all competitors have appropriate Public Liability Insurance and are ready to show it to the show team if asked.

Thank you in advance for taking the time to read the schedule thoroughly, for respecting our rules and conditions of entry – and we look forward to welcoming you for a great day at the Show.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO THE 2026 ELLINGHAM SHOW.

1. The signature of the participant on an Entry Form is acknowledgement that he/she understands and agrees with the Rules and Conditions contained in the ERAS schedule 2026 and has adequate Public Liability Insurance (PLI). Competitors must understand the conditions of entry for their Classes.
2. ERAS expects everyone connected with the Show to meet their responsibilities for their own health and safety and also for others attending the show. Section heads will require sight of the PLI policy, or photocopy, for all trade stands, showground attractions and other participants at their discretion.
3. Any abusive behaviour towards stewards, judges or show helpers will NOT be tolerated and will lead to being exited from the Showground.
4. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel entry or entries made by any person, if they shall deem it fit to do so, without giving any reason for so doing, and the right to cancel any Class or Classes, refunding any fees paid in respect thereof.
5. No prizes shall be awarded when, in the opinion of the Judges, there is not sufficient merit, and the Judges have the power to divide any prize.
6. No appeal can be made against the decision of the Judges, whose decision shall be final.
7. All Cups and Trophies won in 2026 must be returned to the Show by 1st July 2027.
8. No refunds will be made for the cancellation of an entry or entries by a competitor, exhibitor or trader after the 18th July 2026 with the exception of livestock competitors, who must produce a Veterinary Surgeon's certificate.
9. All dogs must be kept on non-retractable leads, unless competing in appropriate classes/events.
10. ERAS reserves the right to examine through one of the Veterinary Surgeons any animal showing signs of infection or contagious disease. If it is then thought necessary, the owner must remove the animal from the Showground immediately.
11. Owners will be responsible for any costs for attention by the Veterinary Surgeons or Farriers on the field.
12. It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure that the classes they enter do not clash.
13. In the unlikely event of the cancellation, postponement or abandonment of the Show by the ERAS Executive Committee through circumstances beyond their control, refunds of fees will be made at the discretion of the ERAS Executive Committee.
13. General Data Protection Regulation: you may already be aware that since May 2018, organisations are permitted only to hold and use personal data with the consent of the person concerned. As part of your association with ERAS you may provide, or already have provided, personal details which we keep on a file (database) and use to contact you. This data is only used for the administration of the Show. E-mails may be sent out to you in batches but we will not disclose any information to anyone for any other purpose.
14. Please note, all attractions are subject to amendment nearer to show day for operational reasons.
15. To the best of our knowledge, all information & rules correct at time of schedule being published.

All exhibitors must be covered by their own Public Liability Insurance

HORSE SHOW

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO THE HORSE SHOW

1. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel entry or entries made by any person, if they shall deem it fit to do so, without giving any reason for so doing, and the right to cancel any Class or Classes, refunding any fees paid in respect thereof.
2. Any abusive behaviour towards stewards, judges or show helpers WILL NOT be tolerated and will lead to being removed from the Showground.
3. No prizes shall be awarded when, in the opinion of the Judges, there is not sufficient merit.
4. No appeal can be made against the decision of the Judges, whose decision shall be final. The Judges have the right to disqualify any Competitor for abuse of whip or spurs, cruelty, or discourteousness.
5. Only Officials and Competitors (and their grooms in Showing Classes as required) are allowed in the Judging Rings.
6. Any objections must be made in writing to the Secretary within half an hour of the event finishing, together with the sum of £50 pounds - returnable at the discretion of the Committee.
7. No responsibility whatsoever is accepted by the Society, or any of its Officers or Servants, for any accident or loss on the Showground to spectators, competitors, their horses, or property. All exhibitors must be covered by their own 'Public Liability' insurance.
8. All Cups and Trophies having been won in 2026 must be returned to the Secretary by 1st July 2027. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of any future cups being won. Should a named Cup or Trophy not be available for presentation the Society reserve the right to present another in its place or to withdraw the award? All Cups and Trophies are Perpetual unless otherwise stated.
9. Cancellation of an entry or entries by a competitor/exhibitor after the 26th July 2026 will result in no refunding of any fees paid in respect thereof, with the exception of livestock who must produce a Veterinary Surgeon's certificate. Must be received before the day of the Show.
10. All dogs must be kept on leads (unless competing in appropriate classes/events).
11. The Society reserves the right to examine through one of the Veterinary Surgeons any animal showing signs of infection or contagious disease, this also includes any welfare issues that may arise. If it is then thought necessary, the owner must remove the animal from the Showground immediately. Owners are advised to have had their animals vaccinated against Equine Flu.
12. Competitors are advised to acquaint themselves with the conditions of entry given for their relevant Classes.
13. Owners will be responsible for any costs for attention by the Veterinary Surgeons or Farriers on the field.
14. No pony or horse, under the age of four, should be entered in the Ridden Classes.
15. In the event of Classes running late we reserve the right to transfer Classes to unoccupied Rings and use available judges. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the classes they enter do not clash.
16. In the unlikely event of the cancellation, postponement, or abandonment of the Show by the Executive Committee through circumstances beyond their control, refunds of fees will be made at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
17. Appropriate riding clothes should be worn, and hard hats must be worn by anyone riding on the showground. Jumping riders must wear an approved hat, which includes a permanently fitted non-detachable harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Riding hats to be PAS 015 (2011), VG1 01.040 (2014-2012), ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), Snell E2016, AS/NZS 3838 (2003 onwards) with kite mark. Further information can be on The British Horse Society website. We also advise back protectors to be worn in all jumping classes.

18. To the best of our knowledge, all information & rules are correct at the time of schedule going to print.
19. No Lunging in the Horse Lines
20. **STALLIONS MUST DISPLAY STALLION DISCS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BRIDLE AND A WHITE TAIL RIBBON.**

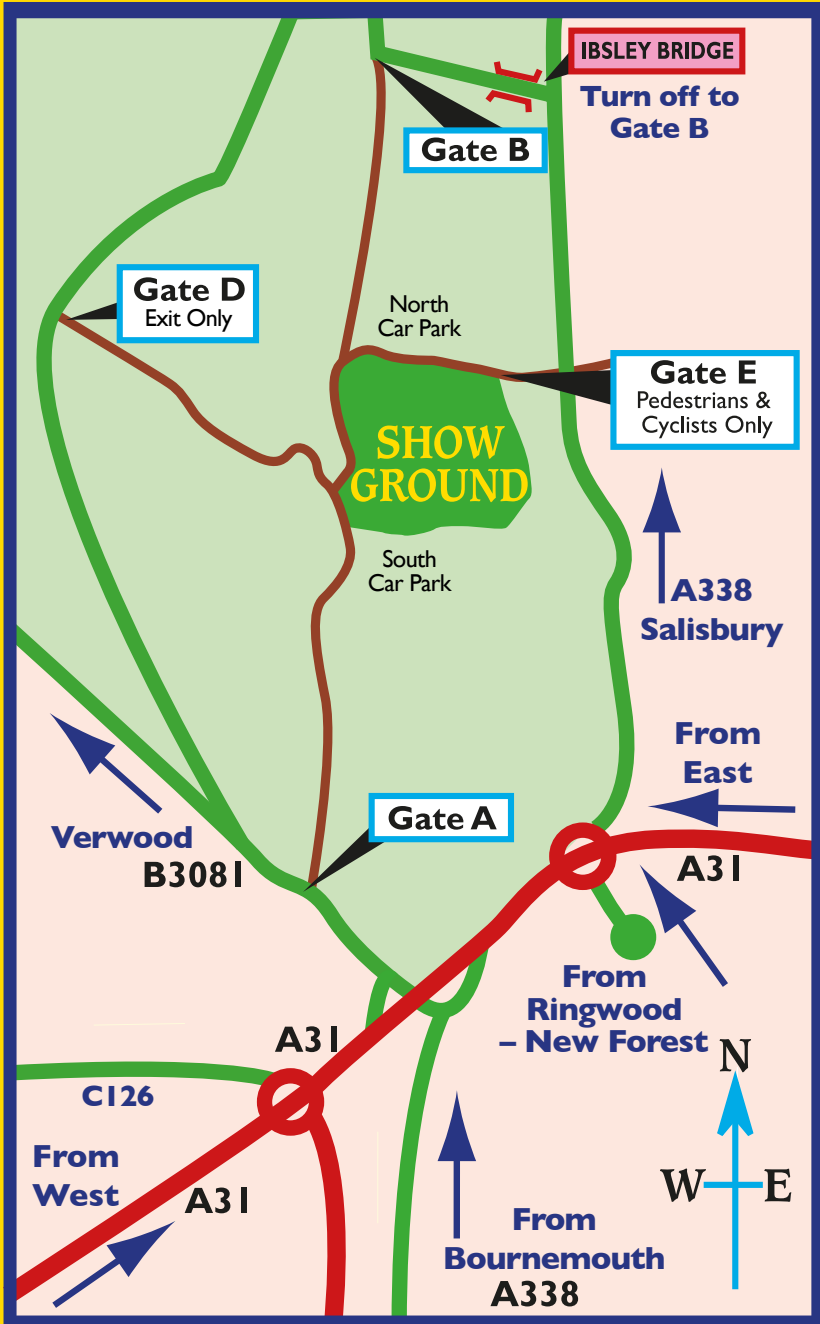
